As a class we will experience positive and negative discrimination to help us have some understanding of what it feels like to be discriminated against - both positively and negatively. Then we will be exploring trailblazers in black art - expressing feelings of discrimination through art.

History

In 'Maafa', we will learn about: ancient African kingdoms, specifically focusing on the Kingdom on Benin; development of the transatlantic slave trade; Britain's role in the slave trade; human impact; everyday life on plantations; rebellion and marronage; causes and consequences of the abolition of the slave trade and slavery; colonisation of Africa; black people in 20th century Britain; Race Relations Act; Equality Act; significant black Britons; multiculturalism.


