Animal Safari: Year group visit to Paignton Zoo. Meet the animals. Creep, Crawl and Wriggle: Take part in a minibeast safari across the field.

Understanding the world

Animal Safari: Looking After Animals - Explore how to look after pets. Animal Safari - BeeBot exploration and programming. Scales, Fur and Feathers - Sorting animals based on their features. Animal Babies - Exploring animal's young and how they look. Animal Lunch - Investigation into food chains and carnivores and herbivores. Longest, Shortest, Tallest - Explore size of animals using trundle wheel and research further using iPads. School Safari - Explore what animals live on school grounds. Animals Around the World - Identify and compare features of animals from around the world. Comparing Places - Learn about the Serengeti and compare with animals that live in the UK. Handa - Read Handa's Hen and recreate own version of the story. Look After Us - Discuss extinction and complete a 'litter hunt' around the school. Visit from a Vet - Arrange local vet visit and ask questions. Animals who Help us - Learn about assistance animals. Creep, Crawl and Wriggle: Looking After Nature - Investigation into minibeast food. Same and Different - Compare minibeasts and their features. Snails - Read Snail Trail and create map of the snail's journey.
