School Sport Premium Funding 2016-2017

The Sport Premium Funding is additional money allocated to schools in order to improve their provision of PE and sport. Schools are free to decide how they spend the additional funding, in line with the following 3 key aims:

- 1) Improve the quality of PE
- 2) Increase participation in PE and sport
- 3) Promote the development of healthy lifestyles within the pupils

Schools are accountable for the way that they spend the funding; this forms part of the OFSTED inspection process.

Each year, some of the school's budget is allocated to support the development of PE as a curriculum subject. This funding is in addition to this and allows us to extend the range of opportunities and outcomes for our pupils.

The funding runs over a financial year (April to March), rather than the academic year.

How we spent the funding (2016-2017)

The South Dartmoor Sports Partnership - our rationale for buying in.

Buying into the sports partnership has provided the following:

- Opportunities to pool resources in collaboration with other partner schools to enable additional opportunities for development and participation.
- Professional development opportunities for staff such as training courses and in-school support from Lead Teachers from local partnership secondary schools.
- A wide range of coordinated inter-school sporting events across the local learning community enabling significant numbers of children to attend and compete.
- Specialist coaches leading activities during our sports week
- Access to specialist advice and support.
- Access to regular subject leader support meeting to moderate provision and share good practice.

The impact of the money spent.

South Dartmoor Sports Partnership / SSC role impact

- Professional development courses / training have improved teaching practice and therefore provision for our pupils.
- Participation in local learning community sports events increased pupil participation rates, furthered the range of opportunities offered to pupils and promoted lifelong enjoyment in sport.
- Success in local tournaments has enabled children to take part in subsequent finals which include all schools in the South West
- Specialist teachers from the partnership have supported the delivery of PE in several year groups

Transportation Impact

Booking coaches to transport children to events has enabled us to take 60+ children to festivals and competitions. This has helped us increase the participation in both recreational and competitive sporting events - giving more children an opportunity to experience level 2 competition (competing against other schools and learning partnerships).

Pool hire impact

In addition to every child competing in an 'athletics' style sports day, hiring a pool has enabled us to give 64 children from KS2 an opportunity to compete in swimming races in a level 3, intra school competition. Again increasing participation in competitive sport.

High impact sports visitors' impact

Booking companies such as 'Team Extreme' has given all of our KS2 children an opportunity to experience an alternative sport. This has certainly increased the engagement in physical activity and sport. Some children who do not take part in other sports have been inspired by the scooter workshops and are consequently more active outside of school.

Coaches from Little Ruckers taught all children in KS1 the basics of rugby and inspired them for their future. In addition to increasing participation during our sports week, many children have joined the local rugby club.

CPD Swimming Training impact

To ensure the children are making the required progress in swimming, our staff have been trained by a fully qualified swimming instructor. This included support staff as well as teaching staff. Staff now have the subject knowledge and confidence to effectively teach the children.

Contribution to residential impact

To make sure children are given a broad range of OAA opportunities, we subsidised the cost of the residentials, with the aim of ensuring that the majority of children in KS2 participated in each of the 4 residential visits. Whilst at the various residential settings, children developed a variety of skills, such as: risk taking, collaboration, teamwork and leadership, as well as developing their confidence.
